DOMESTIC STUDENTS STUDYING OVERSEAS

2019 UNDERGRADUATE ENTRY

Regardless of previous country of study, Australian citizens, Australian permanent residents and New Zealand citizens are considered domestic students for the purposes of admission to the University of Melbourne. Domestic students apply for Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP) at the University through the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC).

WHEN TO APPLY

Timely applications for most courses close at the end of September for Semester 1 (March) entry. Note: the Bachelor of Fine Arts - Animation, Dance, Film and Television, and Screenwriting have a timely application closing date at the end of August. Some courses also offer Semester 2 (July) entry, and timely applications for these close in early June.

You must submit your final results to VTAC (not the University) as per the instructions on the VTAC website at:

vtac.edu.au/applying/documentation

When applying through VTAC, course codes that end in '1' reflect a CSP.

WHAT IT WILL COST

As a domestic undergraduate student, you will enrol in a CSP, which is subsidised by the Australian Government.

You pay a student contribution, with the amount determined each year by the Australian Government, based on the subjects in which you enrol. The exact cost of your student contribution depends on the subjects you take, not the course you are studying.

The 2019 student contribution amounts will be made available in late 2018 at:

Payment of the student contribution can be made upfront, or can be deferred through HECS-HELP for eligible students.

WHEN ARE OFFERS MADE?

For Semester 1 entry, round one undergraduate offers are released in mid January each year.

For Semester 2 entry, round one undergraduate offers are released in mid July each year.

To accept your place, you must follow the instructions provided in the University's offer information which will be emailed to all successful applicants.

WHEN CAN I START?

Semester 1 2019 begins on 4 March.

Semester 2 2019 begins on 29 July.

All students should plan to attend Orientation activities in Melbourne before commencement of classes.

WHAT ARE THE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS?

Applications for Commonwealth Supported Places are generally considered on the basis of academic merit, the number of places available and the demand for the course. All applicants must satisfy course prerequisites. Eligible applicants may

also receive consideration under Access Melbourne, the University's special entry and equity program.

IB, GCE A Levels and many other qualifications from around the world are considered for admission to the University. In most cases, minimum admission requirements for domestic students are equivalent to the entry standards for international students. However, CSPs are offered on the basis of academic merit, and the standard required to receive an offer may be higher than the minimum admission requirement, depending on the demand for the course and the number of CSPs available.

Some undergraduate courses also have extra requirements such as an audition or folio. As an example, all courses offered by the Faculty of Fine Arts and Music have additional requirements, as entry is talent-based. For details, see the VTAC Guide listing for your preferred course/s.
